National youth day District level talent show OSOM 2K22






International Literacy Day, NSS Day Food Distribution, and Book Donation for Anganwadi Children titled as "KOODE"

Report on Food Distribution in Connection with NSS Day Observation




BOOK DONATION DRIVE SEPTEMBER 14TH-17TH


LAHARIVIRUDDHA JWALA 24.10.2022




Street Play at Manjeri New Bus stand and Noble College 2.11.22




HEALTH AWARENESS AND INTERACTIVE SESSION

CHILDREN'S DAY 14.11.22




HEALTH AWARENESS SESSION AT SCHOOL

VACCINATION SURVEY 5.12.2022-7.12.2022











HIV MEDICAL CAMP
